It's impossible to avoid the world-famous beaches when visiting these islands. Whatever you're interested in - snorkeling, scuba diving, boating, fishing, or just lounging on the beach - there are countless places in Bermuda to do them. The most famous beach in Bermuda is Horseshoe Beach. This beach is known for its super soft pink sand, water that is crystal clear, stunning coves, hidden caves, and the laid-back atmosphere. If you'd like to head a little off-shore for diving and snorkeling, there are tons of companies that can help you do just this. Shipwrecks, bright and busy coral reefs, and more are just a few of the places they can take you.

Bermuda is not only spectacularly beautiful, but it's very fascinating, thanks to its long historical record. There are around a hundred forts on the chain of islands, each with its history. There are also plenty of museums to check out, with one of the best being the Bermuda Aquarium, Natural History Museum, and Zoo. In this all-in-one museum, you'll find the first living coral reef exhibit in the world: a 140,000 gallon tank full of a living replicated coral reef environment. The museum also features over 200 species of fish, as well as turtles, seals, lots of birds, and more.

There is plenty to keep you busy during your stay in Bermuda. However, don't forget to stop and take in the naturally beautiful scenery that characterizes these islands. You might want to avoid adventuring into the Bermuda Triangle, although many say it's a prime diving location. Don't forget your US passport card or book if you decide to go.
