The Kilmainham Gaol Historical Museum is a very popular attraction. This historically relevant prison was known for the harsh treatment given to prisoners, many of whom were executed right in this prison. Many of the prisoners housed here were those who rebelled for Ireland's freedom, and the 1916 declaration is even on display inside. In addition, you can also see other exhibits that include prison logs and letters penned by prisoners before their execution. Informative tours can take you into cells and around the prison.

With all the important landmarks, interesting museums, and fun cultural things to do, you will never be bored for a second in Dublin.
