Easy Methods To Switch A Lost Passport

Passports are important documents issued to interested civilians by their native governments. They consist of official photographs of the civilians, their date of birth and full name and allow their holders to safely travel internationally. Essentially, the documents entitle travelers to re-enter their country of origin and are fairly difficult to obtain. For these reasons and more, it is extremely important to begin the process to replace a [lost online passport](#) as quickly as possible.

Misplacing expedited new U.S. passport can be very vulnerable and scary experiences just as losing purses or wallets would be. Once you notice that they are missing, be sure and give yourself about half an hour to search for it actively. Once you report it missing, the Department of State will invalidate it so it's very crucial to make sure first that it isn't tucked away in your suitcase or lying behind your nightstand.

You should complete a form called a DS-64 immediately if you can't find the document. This will allow it to be reported as lost or stolen and once it has been filed properly, the passport will permanently be declared invalid for usage. If you find or recover it down the line, it will not work and should immediately be destroyed at the State Department.

The DS form must be properly filled out and then submitted to your State Department or local embassy. If you want, you can mail the forms to them but make sure and do it with certified mail so you will know when the package arrives at its destination. This will insure that you know when to begin the next step in the long process.

Look on the State Department's official web address for a list of places that accept and process international travel documentation applications. In many cases, it's usually your city's post office. After you have received word that your DS-sixty four papers have been accepted, go to one of these places and start the process of obtaining a replacement passport.

The paperwork required for this stage is called the DS-eleven and should be properly filled out with the correct info. The rest of the process should be familiar to you since you've already been through it once already.

If your travel document was lost or stolen during a trip overseas, things can be tricky since it is impossible to re-enter your native country without the proper international identification. Locate the nearest United States Embassy and head there right away. American Representatives there will be able to help you and will assist you in your quest to get home.

You will need to provide the embassy unit with an itinerary of your travels and the date you plan on returning to your home. They will help you fill out the proper paperwork that will lead to being able to replace a lost United States passport. You most likely will not arrive back home the day that you planned to but the embassy will make sure that you get there as quickly as possible with an [expedited new U.S. passport](#).
