Finding A Replacement Passport USA

A [U S passport replacement](#) may be required for a variety of reasons. A name change, loss or theft or expiration are all possibilities. Marriage, a personal decision or divorce are all potential explanations for a name change. Losing track of passports overseas or within a home country is not all that atypical. Passport expiration comes to fruition after a specified amount of time. Reaching age 16 requires a person to get a new passport for adults. It is not particularly difficult to take action in any of these situations. Things become even easier if one is in possession of a passport that is currently valid. It is possible to expedite the delivery. The forms can be downloaded from the Internet and presented or sent by mail. Heading to the post office is the only thing that needs to be done in order to get a replacement within the USA. If a person is in a foreign country, things get more challenging. No matter the situation, there is a fee and there is documentation that must be submitted.

When a person changes his or her name, form DS-5504 must be submitted but only if the issuance date was within the previous year. Otherwise, form DS-82 must be submitted. It is possible to renew United States passports in the mail when this is the reason for a new one. A name change document like a court order or a marriage certificate must be in the renewal packet.

When a name change has happened, form DS-5504 needs to be filled out. DS-5504 is only meant for people whose current passport was issued within the previous year. When an expiration date is reached, a person needs to get a new one. A passport could expire for a number of reasons. Adult passports hit their expiration date after 10 years. When a child becomes an adult for passport purposes, age 16, that person's passport expires. Otherwise, children's passports expire after five years. Form DS-82 and meeting particular requirements will make it possible for adult passports to be replaced.

In order to get one by mail, it needs to be in a person's care and not have any damage. The old one needs to be sent in with the application. The item has to be under 15 years old. It has to have been acquired after a person's 16th birthday. Additionally, the name on this piece of identifying information should be up to date or any changes should be validated with attached documentation.

If a passport is stolen or lost getting a new one is a bit more complicated. The incident has to be reported before anything else can happen. There is a phone line dedicated to just such a purpose at the US state department. Form DS-64 is another way to report a loss or theft.

At the point that a report is made declaring an item missing, a new one can only be procured by filling out two forms. These forms include a DS-11, an application, and DS-64, a statement about the loss or theft. These forms have to be brought to an authorized passport location, they cannot be sent in the mail. If the incident occurs abroad, then a person has to go to the United States embassy or consulate in that country.

Fees vary depending on the situation. If there is no rush, then the price is lower. For both the traditional identification and a card, the fee is \$140. For someone who just wants the book and not the card, the fee is \$110. In some instances, someone will already have a book and wish to supplement it with a card. This fee is a mere \$30.

Getting a replacement passport requires official documentation and several application forms. There are a variety of reasons like a name change or an expiration that one might need to obtain a new [American passports](#). In both those situations, it can be done by mail.
