Asia is home to many World Heritage Sites which isn't surprising. With Countries like China, Japan and India as well as other Middle Eastern countries, an abundant number of interesting, historical places can be visited. Let's highlight a few of them here.

One of these sites is the Dazu Rock Carvings in China. This collection of sites features 50,000 larger than life statues, with over 100,000 Chinese characters decorating the cliff faces as well. Originally started in 650 AD, these huge monuments are definitely worth seeing for yourself.

The Mausoleum of the First Olin Emperor in Xi'an is also found in China. It was discovered by workers digging a well in 1974 and is famous for its terracotta carvings. Figures represented include warriors, horses, chariots, musicians, acrobats and strongmen and number approximately 8,000. These are life-size creations and attract visitors from all over the world.

Lake Baikal in Russia is the largest freshwater lake in the world, and one of the most biodiverse as well. 1,085 species of plants and 1,550 species of animals make their home in Lake Baikal, and a full 80% of these species can only be found at this lake. One of these animals is the adorable Baikal Seal.

Sri Lanka is home to an ancient stone fortress called Sigiriya. This gigantic fortress is surrounded by moats, gardens and deteriorated ancient structures. Unusual stone formations are found around this fortress many of which are believed to have been used by our ancient ancestors perhaps five thousand years ago. The opportunity to view ancient frescoes and terraced gardens provides an opportunity to imagine what life was like for some of our earliest ancestors.

Socotra in the Indian Ocean is a chain of four islands. Because they have been cut off from the mainland for so long, Socotra has developed its own very unique set of natural inhabitants. In fact, a full third of its 800 species of flora can't be found anywhere else on the planet. It's this fact that has given it the status as the most alien looking place on Earth, certifiable by the warped looking dragon's blood tree.
